# SPEYSIDE

They are often characterised by their smooth, approachable nature, with flavour profiles that frequently feature notes of honey, ripe orchard fruits, vanilla, and delicate floral undertones. Many expressions also showcase sherry cask influence, adding layers of dried fruit, spice, and chocolate. While some distilleries produce peated expressions, Speyside is generally known for its refined, non-smoky character, making it an ideal introduction to Scotch whisky.

What sets Speyside apart—much like the Champagne region of France—is its deeply ingrained heritage, strict geographical identity, and unparalleled craftsmanship. Just as Champagne's terroir and climate influence the grapes that make its world-famous sparkling wines, Speyside's pure water sources, rich barley-growing land, and time-honoured distilling traditions shape the distinctive character of its whiskies. The region's prestige and consistency have made it the heart of Scotland's whisky industry, much as Champagne remains the undisputed leader in fine sparkling wine.

# HIGHLANDS

The Highlands region of Scotland is a vast and varied expanse, stretching from the southern fringes near the Central Belt all the way to the remote northern reaches.

Its towering mountains, expansive glens, and deep lochs serve as a dramatic backdrop to the creation of some of Scotland's most iconic whiskies. From the mist-covered peaks to the gentle slopes, the Highlands is home to a broad spectrum of distilleries, each influenced by the diverse landscapes that surround them.

Whiskies from the Highlands tend to be full-bodied and complex, with a characteristic richness that mirrors the rugged environment. Common flavor profiles include a deep maltiness, layered with notes of honey, heather, and dried fruits, like raisins and sultanas. Some whiskies, particularly from the central Highlands and areas near the coast, carry a mild peaty influence, while others present a more delicate balance of floral, vanilla, and spicy undertones, with hints of citrus and oak. The Highlands' whiskies can range from smooth and elegant to bold and full-flavored, but they all carry the unmistakable influence of the region's majestic, unyielding landscape.

While not officially designated as a whisky region, the Islands of Scotland — including the Isle of Skye, Orkney, Jura, and others — have earned their own reputation for distinctive, island-inspired whiskies that reflect the stark, rugged, and often wild landscapes they are born from. The isolation of these islands, coupled with their harsh coastal environments, has resulted in whiskies that speak to the untamed nature of their surroundings.

# ISLANDS

Flavors in the Islands region are often bold and complex, with coastal influences that bring salty, briny, and peaty qualities to the forefront. These whiskies often evoke the raw energy of the sea, carrying notes of iodine, seaweed, and smoky peat, intermingled with subtle sweetness from the oak casks. Many distilleries on the islands are known for their use of peat, with some expressions taking on a pronounced smoky, medicinal quality.

However, the Islands also showcase a diversity of profiles, with some whiskies offering softer, more refined notes of honey, toffee, and malt, balanced with a touch of spice and citrus zest. The landscapes — ranging from the jagged cliffs of Skye to the rolling hills of Orkney — leave an indelible mark on the whisky, giving each dram a sense of place that is as wild and windswept as the islands themselves.

Campbeltown's remaining distilleries are symbols of independence. Springbank, one of the last truly independent distilleries in Scotland, handles every stage of production in-house, using traditional methods and offering both peated and unpeated expressions.

Glen Scotia, dating back to 1832, produces whiskies known for their rich fruit, coastal character, and that unmistakable salty note.

Small in number but big in personality, Campbeltown distilleries focus on small-batch, high-quality whisky with a strong sense of identity. Free from the commercial pressures of larger regions, they offer a haven for those seeking something rare and distinctive.

Campbeltown whiskies are rich, complex, and often strike a balance between salty, earthy, and sweet. The briny sea air leaves its mark, while the peat is nuanced and complementary.

Expect notes of dried fruit, toffee, spice, wax, and nuts—layered, evolving, and unmistakably Campbeltown.

Campbeltown may produce less whisky than other regions, but its rarity only adds to the allure. It's bold. It's unique. And it's exactly what whisky should be: true to itself.
